
N.B. There are currently Pupil Support Worker Posts advertised however please note that these are for the Fraserburgh Network and not specifically within our school as the original advert may have suggested.

REMINDERS...

HEALTHY SNACKS - Staff have asked to remind parents and children that they should be bringing **healthy snacks Mon-Thurs**. An increasing number of children are not bringing any snack which also can be detrimental to their learning throughout the morning, particularly if they are hungry. Snack attack offers healthy choices - most items costing only 15p - 20p. (A great way to get rid of any loose change you may have!)

WATER BOTTLES - Your child should be bringing a water bottle to school to have in the class. Being hydrated is key to being a healthy learner. **NO JUICE** please. If children are bringing diluted juice to have with their lunch then it should be in a separate bottle from the one they use in class.
(If required, water bottles can be purchased from the school office - £1.50)

GYM - Please ensure your child has everything they require for PE lessons, including a hair band for tying up long hair. Given the previous issues with lice it would be sensible to have long hair tied back/pleated anyway, however it must be tied up for safety within the gym.



Please note that due to building works connected with the new houses, there will be a temporary bus stop outside the school gates from Tuesday 12th February until Friday 22nd February.

This is likely to cause further congestion at the school gates as parents will not be able to park at the bus stop.

I appreciate some of our children need to be driven to school but this would be a great opportunity to begin a new habit of walking to school to decrease congestion at this time.


I was so pleased with their communication skills and their ability to see various points of view and also their ability to come up with solutions. Perhaps a politician amongst them in the future.
