Learning Opportunities

Over the past 4 weeks the children have been engaged in various learning opportunities relating to Spring and Fairy Gardens which have seen them using their problem solving skills and creativity to find and develop an area within the playground to build our Fairy Garden. They have engaged in some planning and preparation for our upcoming **Daffodil Tea fundraiser** as they had a walk within the local area requesting various businesses and meeting places to display posters and sell raffles. Each session also attended the library for an informal story session which we will carry on each month, from now until the end of the academic year.

Over the coming weeks we would expect to begin looking into Easter along with a variety of other themes directed by the children. We also aim to make greater connections with Invercairn Court in order to attend a play date there, once a month for each session.

The nursery team will also be discussing possible future targets with you in due course, as we work together to support your child's learning and development. If you have their "Share the Learning booklet" at home, please return these, to help us achieve this goal.

Nursery Improvements

Plans to continue to improve upon literacy development and encouraging the children's love of literature are developing well through the implementation of plans made to visit the library more regularly, purchasing new resources and introducing a story of the week.



Outdoor play is also progressing well and we hope to continue this as the weather improves. Each week we aim to attend an outdoor play session with Primary 1 in order to support in the transition, as this is fast approaching.

We are striving towards continual and ongoing improvement and have established a question of the month. This is located on top of the radiator in the cloak room area to the right of the play room door. Please take a few moments to have a look and contribute towards this during drop off or pick up.
