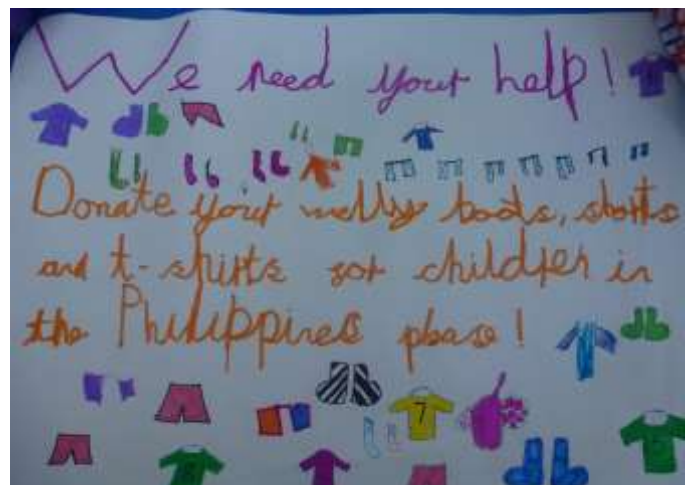
Well done to the boys and girls (and parents) who represented our school at the Doors Open event and Fraserburgh Heritage Centre.

Excellent ambassadors for our school!

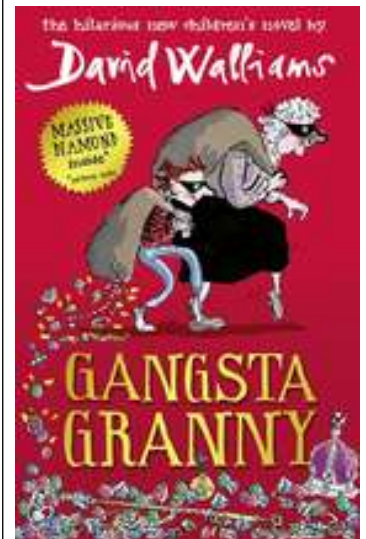
### Philippines Appeal
